League Roundup



League Play will be winding down soon with only a handful of games left in all leagues.

The East Side Mario's Team Entry League regular season has wrapped up its regular season with the Kevin Gouthro's rink taking top honors. Skip Kevin was joined in the first place finish by Walter Nichols, Anthony Boudreau and Robbie Biron. Second spot was taken by the Mel Windsor rink with skip Mel, Keith MacEachern, Bryant Cormier and Bob Smith. The playoff format for this league is a bit unique this season with a weekend tournament being run to determine a playoff winner on Saturday, April 13 and Sunday, April 14. It will be a bracket format with a single elimination so only winners move forward. The top eight teams will compete with the ninth place team from the regular season being eliminated. Everyone is welcome to drop by the club to take in some of the Team Entry playoff action. Check online for schedule.

The Mixed League still has a couple of weeks left to play and there are a number of teams vying for top spot in the second half. There are no playoffs in this league as the season is split into two, teams being shuffled after the completion of the first half, with the best record in the round robin format taking the win in each of the halves. With a few teams being close, a winner for round two will likely not be decided until all games are completed.

The Schooner Doubles league also has two nights left in its schedule and it looks like Julia Cormier has wrapped up top spot. Doubles saw a drop in numbers this season and a few people drop out during the year. The Schooner executive will look at whether or not it's viable to maintain the doubles league when it does a re-evaluation of our league structure for next season.

In the Firestop Enterprises Men's League we are down to the final game in the playoffs. After a 3 game round robin to determine seeding, semi final games were played to see who would go to the playoff championship game. The Gordie Cormier rink will take on the Mel Windsor rink after Cormier defeated Russell Fitzgerald and Windsor took down the Brian Laughlin rink. The championship game is slated for Thursday, April 11 at 7pm.

Friday afternoon Matinee Curling had a good season this year with lots of participation from many members. There is one more Matinee Drop In session scheduled and that will be Friday, April 12 from 1-3. Open to all members. There is no Matinee Curling scheduled for April 19 due to the John Bonaparte Memorial Spiel.

So another great season of league curling at the schooner. As previously mentioned, the Schooner Executive will be doing an evaluation of league structure at the club prior to next season to see if there are any changes to leagues and/or schedules that would benefit the Schooner membership and the club in general. Winners would continue to play in the 'A' division while all teams losing on Friday would fall to play in 'B'. Once you were in the 'B' division you had to continue to win as a second loss would mean being eliminated.

After all games were played it was the duo of Julia Cormier and Robbie Biron who took first place in the 'A' Division, defeating the team of Benito Delorenzo and Shane Langille. Sport NS "Sportsweep" Fundraising Program

The Schooner Curling Club recently participated in the ready-made fundraising program from Sport Nova Scotia call 'Sportsweep'. SportSweep is a turn-key, low effort and low risk ticket campaign designed to raise money for sport teams, sport clubs and sport organizations throughout Nova Scotia. Sport Nova Scotia handles the lottery license, solicitation of prizes, and printing of the tickets. All we needed to do was sell the tickets! Tickets were \$5.00 each and we retain \$3.75 from each ticket. That's 75% of the profit! Ticket sales ended on March 29, 2024 and all tickets were returned to Sport NS by the April 5 deadline The draw will take place on April 12, 2024, at 11:00 AM at the Sport NS office in Halifax. The winner will be contacted by Sport NS by phone or email. In the event the prize is unclaimed within 90 days, a second draw will take place on June 7, 2024 at 11am and another winner announced. Sport Nova Scotia has arranged for a great grand prize package for the winner that includes \$2000 CASH plus an Oak Island Resort & Conference Centre Getaway (two night stay in a two bedroom chalet with a \$500 food and beverage credit).

In total, the club sold 674 Sportsweep tickets which means we will make just over \$2500. A very good return for a little effort and no risk. A big thank you to Lynn Kelly for coordinating the project and organizing the ticket distribution and sales and thanks to everyone who sold tickets. Sport NS is starting another Sportsweep draw with sales running from April 15 to August 23, 2024 and a draw date of September 6. The grand prize is the same. Since this is off season for us it is likely not worthwhile for us to participate but we hope they do a third draw next winter.

Block Draws

Block Draws are being held at the club now. Boards are posted and you can simply put your name in any block that is not taken already. Blocks are \$5 each and there 100 blocks to choose from. Prizes are half of the proceeds raised. Once all blocks are sold in a draw, a winner will be picked and then another draw will start. Proceeds are going to the Schooner roof fund. Women's World Curling Championship

It was a great week at the BKT Women's World Curling Championship with big crowds, lots of great curling and excitement and lots of spinoffs for the downtown Sydney and surrounding communities. At to top it all off we saw Canada's Team Homan take home the gold medal with a dramatic win over Switzerland in the final on Sunday. And what a great crowd cheering them on in that final game. Congratulations to Skip Tirinzoni and her team on their silver medal and to team Korea on their Bronze medal finish, defeating Italy to take the medal home. The Women's Worlds will be held in Korea next year so that will go a long way for creating some buzz about the team and the event. There were many Schooner, Sydney and Strait Area curling club members that volunteered along with many from the community in general. Everyone did a great job and made the event that much better. The 50/50 draws will again be shared among local curling clubs as it was in the 2019 Scotties when it was held in Sydney. This time around, the Strait and Area Community Curling Club (SACCC) will also be sharing in the proceeds. Unlike the Scotties 50/50, this time proceeds will not be shared equally but rather split by percentage based on membership. That means Schooner receives 16%, SACCC receives 17% and the Sydney Curling Club gets 67%. Expenses such as bank fees, fees to the fundraising company that provided the equipment, etc. are all also shouldered by each club at the same percentage as they share. These are important funds for all clubs as we are all in need of roof repairs to our buildings. We are also hoping to share in some of the profits from ticket sales but that hasn't been fully decided yet and the way it is

The success of the Women's World championships and the crowds that it attracted in Sydney make a good case for the area to win another opportunity to host a high level curling event. The next goal will be a Brier, the Canadian Men's Curling Championship event, but the requirements for that are slightly outside of our capacity right now. Possibly an exception will be made after we have proven that the area will support the event after having two successful women's events in Centre 200. Time will tell. Fingers crossed.
