League Play



League play got underway in November and is in full swing now. The Don Cherry's Team Entry league got the season going and is sporting pretty much the same ten teams that competed last year with a few minor changes in personnel on a few of them. Wally MacDonald lost lead Anthony Boudreau who aided them to a playoff championship last season. Boudreau could not return do to work commitments. Dave Boudreau has joined the MacDonald rink as lead. The Gordie Cormier rink has added new Schooner member Kevin Gouthro to replace Rob Agnew. Gouthro started at the second spot but has recently been doing Mate duties with Stephen Leslie filling the second position. The Chris 'Slugger' MacLeod has a new lead in Matt Tubrett, replacing Jeff Steele and Omar Roach also added a new lead in Justin Humphrey who takes Matt MacPherson's place. The biggest change in a team, and you could almost call them a new team, is the one that transitioned from the Martin Campbell rink to the Russell Fitzgerald rink. Martin decided not to commit to Sunday curling this season and it looked like the team would not compete when Kristal Coffin also did not return. Fitzgerald and last year's second, Samantha Campbell, added Julia Cormier and new member Brandon MacSween to the roster to compete on Sunday.

The big story from Team Entry so far is of two teams, the Wally MacDonald rink and the Chris 'Slugger' MacLeod rink, one who is on the way up and one who is on the way down. Last season could only be described as mediocre for MacLeod who finished with a losing record and tied for second last in the competitive Sunday league. This year, the story is much different so far with MacLeod being one of two undefeated teams in the league and sitting in first place overall after a month of play. Omar Roach is also undefeated but has one less game played. MacLeod's team is playing well at all positions and have shown a lot more discipline in their shot selections and improvement in their shot making. MacLeod himself, who missed the first two games of the season, is showing no ill effect from the late start and is curling very well as was evident in a recent win against the Greg Ferguson rink. MacLeod drew to the button against two to take a single point in the seventh end of a tied game and then made two great shots in the eighth to steal and solidify the win. In another win they embarrassed the strong Gordie Cormier rink in a shortened game. If this strong play can continue, MacLeod will be vying for the Team Entry title this season for sure.

On the other hand, the Wally MacDonald rink could not have gotten off to a worse start. They are currently the only Sunday team without a victory and things aren't going to get any easier for them. They play their first game in December against the undefeated MacLeod rink, a game that could breathe life into MacDonald's season if he wins or a game that could put MacDonald out of title contention at a very early juncture of the season. MacLeod has already defeated MacDonald in an exhibition match, erasing a seven point deficit and winning in an extra end. No one would have predicted this abysmal start for skip MacDonald who is normally one of the top teams in this league, having finished tied for second in last year's regular season before taking the playoff title and having won either the regular season or playoffs in the four previous years, taking both of them one year. Along with facing MacLeod early in December, MacDonald also has a number of difficult challenges ahead in round one with games against strong rinks like Gordie Cormier, Brian Laughlin and Omar Roach. Don't count MacDonald out just yet as we have seen how well his team can play in the past but, if he can't muster up wins against the top teams now, he will have to wait for the playoffs to see if he can extend his title streak to five years because the regular season will slip away.

Along with MacLeod and Roach, other teams with a good start in the Team Entry are the Brian Laughlin rink, the Cormier rink, the Ferguson rink and the Wayne 'Bull' Bonnell rink who all have two wins. Bonnell rebounded from a week one annihilation at the hands of the Laughlin rink that stretched the limits of the score board even after only a few ends but has figured things out quickly and has won the last two weeks. Given the number of teams who are grouped closely at this early point in the season it looks like there will be a few teams vying for the league title this year.

The Cape Breton Beverages Pepsi Mixed League was the second league to begin play and sees another year with twelve teams taking part. This is a perfect number for the league as it allows us to avoid a late draw on any evening unless there are outside circumstances. After a trial run last year that was very popular, the Mixed League will once again play two regular seasons as opposed to one and a playoff. There will be a round robin played in the first half with a winner being crowned, then teams will be remade and a second round will begin. There is good parity among the teams in this league and no one has come out as the obvious favorite after the first month of play. The Old Triangle Men's League is also underway again this year and is, again, a very competitive league with many good teams. Parity is also evident here as all teams

have points on the board and there have already been four ties registered in the first month of play. The Keith MacEachern rink is the only undefeated team but owns two of the four ties, keeping them close to second place rinks Gordie Cormier and Sid Murray who are just one point behind. Even this early in the season it's safe to say that the Men's League will be close all year and the winner won't be decided until very late in the schedule. At this point, any team in that league can win.

The Schooner Junior Program started up for the season on Saturday, November 18, with a hugely successful orientation and fun day that was free for kids who wanted to come and try curling. A large number of kids showed up included a few international students that are attending high school in Cape Breton for the year. While everyone who attended the first day didn't join, numbers are up in the Junior Program and that's great news. The Juniors have also been running a fundraiser again this year in partnership with the Cape Breton Fudge Company. They were selling a variety of gift-boxed fudge and a part of the sale was kept by the program. While the fundraiser was still going on until December 2nd, junior coordinator Nadine Neima-Drover said that early sales looked good and was optimistic that the sale would be very successful, much like the one they had done two seasons ago. The Junior Program takes the ice on Saturday afternoons at the club but sometimes does make up practices on Sunday if there are club events on Saturday such as spiels. They also have attended spiels in Port Hawkesbury and at the Sydney Curling Club in past seasons and will likely do so again this year. It's been a fantastic start and we wish them great success for the coming season.



Opening Spiel Wrap-up

The Stephen's Rona Opening Spiel was held at the club from October 30 to November 5 with a break in curling on Halloween. A total of twelve teams took part in the first curling event of the season, six teams on the Monday/Thursday/Saturday division and six in the Wednesday/Friday/Saturday division. This was the first spiel that was handled by the newly appointed Bonspiel Committee and they did a great job as was evident by the competitive games and the close finish at the end by a number of teams. The Wally MacDonald rink took top spot in the event with a total of thirty points but only three and a half points separated teams that finished second through seventh, many of the spots being decided by plus minus and some where a very slim margin. Keith MacEachern took the runner up spot with 27.5 points and Stephen Leslie came third with 27. Joining Wally in the champions spot was Lonnie Howe, Kathy Gale and Janet Gallivan. Keith had Kevin Gouthro, Julia Cormier and Georgette Sparkes with him in second and Stephen Leslie was joined by Mike Cormier, Lynn Kelly and Chris Webb. Cal Thistle and Richard Lorway finished tied with 26 points but Thistle edged his way into fourth spot with a +5 while Lorway only had a +3 to earn fifth place honors. Cal was joined by Barb Thistle, Bryant Cormier and Marg Kingsbury while Richard had Cheryl MacKinnon, Todd MacAulay and Steve Jurcina aiding him.

Thank you to everyone who took part, especially those joining us for the first time. Four of those curlers, Kevin Gouthro, Marg Kingsbury, Maureen Smith and Bob Smith, have all joined us as members for the season.

A big thank you to the newly formed Bonspiel Committee who did a great job with their inaugural event. 2019 Scotties Coming to Cape Breton

It's official. The 2019 Scotties Tournament of Hearts will be held at Sydney's Centre 200 as was announced at a public event on Friday, November 3. Representatives from Curling Canada, the local bid committee and government along with a large group of Cape Breton curling fans were on hand for the announcement. This will mark the first time the Scotties has returned to Nova Scotia since it was held in Halifax in 1992. Curling Canada said the Sydney bid was strong, having deposits on over 900 full event packages, support from local and Provincial governments and a good response from the local business community.

The 2019 Scotties will boast a sixteen team field, one from each of our ten provinces and four territories, Team Canada, the 2018 Scotties winner, and one wild card team that will be decided just before the main event begins. The tournament will run from February 16-24, 2019, with the eventual winner given the honor of calling themselves Team Canada and wearing the maple leaf when competing at the World Championships in Esbjerg, Denmark. TSN is the official TV partner of the event and will have complete coverage from the opening wild-card game to the gold medal match.

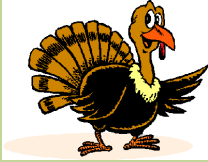
Now the real work begins. Organizing the event and the hundreds of volunteers required will be no small task. The payoff is great for Cape Breton however with national TV exposure for the Island and an estimated economic benefit of between six and twelve million dollars. Lighting Upgrade

The project to upgrade the Schooner lighting is a go. At a special general meeting held at the club on Thursday, November 9, the membership in attendance approved the expenditure allowing the project to move forward. Efficiency Nova Scotia will be covering 65% of the total cost and the club will shoulder the remaining 35% with the help of financing through Nova Scotia Power. We will be able to spread the cost, interest free, over a two year period. It is hoped that the money saved in power with the new LED lighting will almost cover the monthly costs of the project, essentially making our net cost almost zero for the first two years and after that the saving will be pocketed by the club. We are currently trying to coordinate installation over our Holiday break but that is not yet confirmed.

The Schooner Turkey Spiel is set to get underway on Tuesday, December 5 and will run until Saturday, December 9 when all teams competing will go head to head to determine our winners and who will take home the turkeys. If a number of a member not signed in is drawn, the jackpot carries over and 'Snowballs' into a bigger jackpot for the next draw.
