The first fun night of the season will be held at the club on Saturday, January 16. These nights have always been very popular and we hope that trend continues. Fun nights are open to everyone, no membership required, with a cost of \$7 for non-members and \$4 for members. You get to curl, delicious pizza and a chance at some great prizes. It's really a super deal. For non-curlers, all equipment and instruction is provided, you only need to bring clean, dry sneakers for the ice area. It's great fun and a great night out. All Schooner members are encouraged to bring some friends, family, co-workers, whoever and introduce them to the great sport of curling. Many current Schooner members got their start at a fun night.

League Play



League play was abbreviated a bit in December with the Turkey Spiel and the Holiday break cutting the schedule down in all leagues. Luckily, so far this season there have been no weather delays that affected league play and cut things even further. Play will resume in all leagues in January beginning on January 3 when Team Entry will kick off the 2016 portion of our schedule.

The Men's League finished up round one of its schedule just before the Holidays and will begin round two when it resumes on January 4. After one time through with each team playing all others in the league it is the Stephen Leslie rink sitting on top of the standings with ten points. Leslie won his final game of round one over Cal Thistle who, with a victory in that game, could have taken over first place himself. Currently Thistle sits with seven points along with Gordie Cormier with two teams one point ahead at eight points and two teams one point behind with six. This shows that no one team in the men's has distanced themselves from the pack and that this league won't be decided until very late in the season.

The Mixed League was the most affected by the December schedule interruptions and had only two weeks of play in the month. Heading into the Holiday break it was the Peter MacIntyre rink who held top spot, followed closely by Brian Laughlin only one point behind and last year's playoff champion in this league, Wally MacDonald, only two points out. MacIntyre will have to continue his strong play and winning ways if he hoped to hold onto the lead in this league. There are also many other teams that can catch him and the league championship is still within pretty much anyone's grasp.

The Team Entry league has followed the trend in league play this year and sees a logjam of teams fighting for first overall. With a strong first half we have Wayne 'Bull' Bonnell sitting atop the Team Entry standings with twelve points. Three teams, The Brian Laughlin rink, the Gordie Cormier rink and last year's champions, the Wally MacDonald rink, all sit just two points behind Bonnell but all have a game in hand that, if won, could even them with Bonnell. Thomas Drover sits just behind that trio with eight points, also holding a game in hand over Bonnell. Returning skip Omar Roach has struggled a bit to re-find his winning form after some time away and has managed only two wins so far. However, he and his team have played well and has suffered a couple of very close extra end losses so it would be no surprise to see the Roach rink start winning in the second half and become contenders for the league title. Sophomore skip Rick Billard has had a little trouble finding winning form this season thus far as well but has two victories under his belt. A strong showing as skip in the Turkey Spiel heading into the Holiday break may be the confidence booster he needs to kick start the second half for him and his rink. This league, as it is with the others, is far from being decided and there are a number of teams that can end up in first overall at the end of the season.

Ship Hector Spiel

The Schooner Junior Program continues at the club on Saturday afternoons. This season has seen the ranks tend to lean toward the younger curlers so there is only one session instead of the usual two. The Schooner Juniors will be competing in a spiel being held at the Sydney Curling Club the last weekend of January.

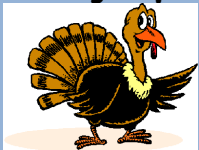
A lady's league didn't quite get off the ground this season again but there was one Friday night event held where the ladies had a 2 on 2 game. Watch for more of these lady's fun nights to be held at the club in the new year. Information will be made available at the club and on the Schooner website and signup sheets will be posted on the club bulletin board.

The Ship Hector Spiel, held in four curling clubs in the New Glasgow area, is set to go from January 22-24. Schooner will be well represented there this year with five rinks from our club making the trip to take part. Skips making a return to the Hector include Brian Laughlin, Wally MacDonald and Wayne 'Bull' Bonnell. Gordie Cormier will be making a return to the new Glasgow event as well but this time as skip of his own rink. Cormier has competed as mate with the Brian Laughlin rink in his past Hector appearances. Rounding out the Schooner contingent will be the Thomas Drover rink. The three day event is held in the Bluenose curling club in New Glasgow, the New Caledonian in Pictou, the Stellar in Stellarton and the Westville Curling Club in downtown Westville. Each team is guaranteed four games with a grueling schedule on Saturday of three games for each team on that day. Some of the Schooner rinks are taking a fifth player to help ease the burden of such a hectic schedule. Twenty teams will share in the prize money which is estimated to total over \$7000 based on 48 teams entering. Many years that number is exceeded with over 50 teams taking part in the event. Best of luck to all Schooner rinks competing at the Hector and we know you will represent our club well.

Power Issues

A rainy and windy night in early December played havoc at the club by causing a power issue with the ice plant. We lost one phase of our three phase power supply which caused the plant to shut down. What made it worse was there was some damage to the wiring in the compressor room that had to be repaired before the ice plant could be returned to operation, causing further problems with the ice that the ice crew needed to repair before play continued. While there is power protection on the circuit, whatever happened went by that and did the damage. Luckily, all the damage was repaired in relatively short order and things got working again. The only cancellation that had to be made was Friday afternoon's Matinee curling. As a result of this incident, the Schooner executive has decided to bring in an electrician to evaluate our system and what protection is in place and make recommendations and repairs where needed. These precautions will hopefully minimize any future damage caused by weather related power issues.

Turkey Spiel



After a bit of a rough start thanks to an early visit from ol' man winter, the annual Schooner Turkey Spiel ended up being another huge success. This year saw twelve teams in total take part, six in the Tuesday/Thursday Division and six on Wednesday/Friday with all teams coming together to compete on Saturday. With an early winter snow on Tuesday evening that cancelled play, bonspiel chair Stephen Leslie was forced to juggle the schedule a bit to make up the cancelled games.

Friday night's schedule was changed to accommodate one make-up with the other two being played early Saturday, prior to the regular scheduled games. After a great week of curling and fun it was the Rick Billard rink that came out on top, distancing himself from the field with three decisive wins. After two games it was only the Keith MacEachern rink that was close to Billard, two points behind, but a win for Billard combined with a loss for MacEachern in their final games solidified first place for the Billard rink. The loss for MacEachern dropped him into third place overall, being overtaken and edged out by half a point by the Gary Landry rink. Landry's second place effort included two wins and a tie. Joining skip Rick Billard in first place was mate Lonnie Howe, second Jolene MacLellan and lead Steve Jurcina. Gary Landry was joined by Walter Nichols, Anthony Boudreau and Ursula Hynes and Keith MacEachern's third place finish was shared by Joe Erickson, Allen Young and Bev Young. All of the top three teams got a Christmas Turkey as a prize. Going into the final draw of the day the Sid Murray rink had a chance of a second place finish but a loss to the Gordie Cormier rink in their final game left them in fourth place. Joining skip Murray was Bill Farr, Dennis Cormier and Darrell Crane. After a tie and a loss in his first two games, a big win on Saturday for Wayne 'Bull' Bonnell vaulted him into fifth place overall. He narrowly edged out the Richard Lorway rink on plus minus. Lorway had one win and two ties to finish in sixth place. Prizes for teams four through six were hams. Joining skip Bonnell was former schooner member Rob Agnew at mate, Georgette Sparkes at second and Laura Rafuse at lead. With Richard Lorway was Mike Cormier, Frances Ford and Bill Moss. Members are reminded that they can leave their money at the bar anytime through the week for Chase the Ace tickets. On the night of the draw, tickets will be purchased on your behalf and, if you are that night's lucky winner, someone will represent you and cut the deck on your behalf. The price of entry is \$5 which buys you five tickets. There are two colors of tickets, red and blue and you can specify which color you want or leave \$10 and get 5 of each. If you can make it for the draws on Thursday evenings you can also represent others and buy tickets on their behalf. The money raised from the Chase the Ace draws has been very important to the club and has put us in a much better financial position, allowed us to do a few extra things around the club and has also allowed us to hold costs to members down at a very reasonable level.
